If you wish to take cremated remains to Sri-Lanka, please ensure you have the following documents.

- Local death certificate
- Cremation certificate
- Acceptance letter from the relevant cemetery where the ashes to be laid- if necessary

Please note: Death & Cremation Certificates should be certified by the Foreign & Commonwealth Office and Sri Lanka High Commission in London.

Further to this, you should check with the airline and airport(s), which you will be travelling through, for their requirements.

However, as Customs must be satisfied that the shipment, in fact, consist of human remains.
